#### Mexico Mission Trip by Charlie Butters

Clean running water. Flush toilets. A home with windows, solid walls and a roof that doesn't leak. Electricity. A job with good wages and reasonable hours. If you ride a Gold Wing, these are things you probably don't give a second thought to. Maybe you've had difficulties in life, but normally we all have these things.

Concepcion is a single mother of 4 living near Vicente Guerrero, Baja California, Mexico. Up until a couple weeks ago, she had none of these things. She was living in this shack..



...which was maybe 10x20, with her children. They had a banyo (you probably know that means "outhouse" but I didn't) but it was 10 years old and plywood doesn't hold up well outdoors for that long. Her "house" was not holding up well either. There was light peaking through her roof in numerous places. It was not at all clean. She cooks the meals for her family in that small, dark space. She had electricity, but it was just an extension cord from her parent's house nearby. There's no running water, and even if there was, it would not be safe to drink without boiling first.

Her husband started building a new home about 3 years ago. He got the walls up, but then left her.

She used to work in the fields every day from 5am to 7pm 7 days a week for about \$12 a day. But sometime after her husband left, she was diagnosed with epilepsy, so now she can only work a couple days a week, so her daughter works. She had a pretty tough life and her story and situation is pretty typical in that area. She still has a tough life, but she heard about Welcome Home Outreach last year and now things are a little better.

In June, I joined 9 others from my church on a mission trip to help WHO finish the house Concepcion's husband started. Vicente Guerrero is on the Baja Peninsula, about 100 miles south of Ensenada. We flew into San Diego, then rented a van for the 185 mile drive down.

Normally WHO will build a new home from the ground up in a week for about \$5000.. The homes are very simple, but an enormous step up from most of the "houses" in the area. Since the walls for Concepcion's house were already there, we were able to do some additional

things, one of which was to dig a new banyo hole. That's what I did for the first two days. It was 3' x 4' and 8 feet deep. We started with picks but that only got us a foot or so before we could no longer swing a pick. We then used a 25 pound, 6 foot long digging bar, which is basically a spear with one end flattened. I had help from 3 others. It took us 2 days.

I then moved on to helping with putting stucco on the walls. There might be a nice tool to do that, but this was all done by hand. Then I helped put up the sheetrock on the ceiling. Others worked on the trusses and the roof, doors, windows, enough wiring for lights and a few outlets, and painting. By the time we were done, it looked like this:

Concepcion still does not have clean running water or indoor plumbing, and she still must work in the fields when she can. But her family now has a solid home with windows and a roof that won't leak, so she has a little less to worry about. For me, it was very gratifying to do something for someone that truly needed it and truly appreciated it. Some people call this "giving back, but my motivation to do it is, in short, "Because Jesus." Long version is because Jesus lived for me, Jesus died for me, Jesus rose for me, Jesus saved me. I would like to quit my job and just do this type of thing for people, not because I think this will get me to heaven, but because I believe I'm going there and I want to help others to show my gratitude for the grace that God has shown me.


