From the treasurer....

Well, seeing that it's unlikely that I'll be able to pop for the 2018 Gold Wing anytime soon, I decided to make the jump to an older GL1800. I purchased a 2002 GL1800 from Powersports Northwest in Centralia. The dealer was very friendly and one of the guys on the sales staff actually races Gold Wings. He rides a GL1800 now, but there is a photo of him taking a curve on a racetrack riding a GL1500. He does some suspension and throttle modifications on the GL1800 to make it as responsive as possible. I don't think I'll be doing that, but I have enjoyed my first few rides on my "new" GL1800. It seems to have been owned by a frequent rider. It has 77,000 miles on it, a Gerbing plug-in, modulating brake lights, some add-on lights and an adjustable windshield upgrade. I'll add a modulating headlight for safety and some passenger arm rests for comfort. I've managed to get in one good ride so far. Mike, Todd, Harry and I made the trip down to Chapter D's January meeting and took a roundabout trip on the way back. The weather wasn't great, but it was certainly passable for a January ride.

Meanwhile I still have my GL1500. I needed to replace the ignition switch and that was quite a job. I had to tackle removing the fairing. Some post somewhere said it could be done in 45 minutes to an hour. I would like to see the footage for how he did that — it took me about 4 hours. A photo of the naked wing is attached. The bolts for the ignition are theft resistant breakaway bolts, so once the fairing is off, you have to cut slots into the remaining head of the bolt so that a screwdriver can be used to remove them. I cut the slot with a hacksaw, but couldn't budge the bolt with a screwdriver. I then emailed Mike about my progress and he advised me to try using a hand impact screwdriver. After a trip to Harbor Freight for a \$9 impact screwdriver, I was able to loosen the bolt with a few whacks. I installed the new ignition, then set about putting all the parts back on the bike. I managed to remember where all the screws and bolts went and ended up with none left over.



MOTORIST AWARENESS BACK SEAT DRIVERS

Recently my wife and I had an opportunity to spend some vacation time in Mazatlan, Mexico. Many times our mode of transportation was by the local bus, taxi, or pulmonia (mainly an open air VW driven only in Mazatlan). Many times I wondered where the driver's attention was focused. The customary stop sign (which in Spanish is ALTO) is merely a yielding event. "Right of way" is simply being able to squeeze into an empty spot in the traffic. Many times I wanted to "mention" to the driver that maybe he is too close to the vehicle in front of us.
