

# Webmaster/Membership Enhancement Input – October 2019 –

### Do you have a Tire Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) on your bike?

Either Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) or aftermarket? The target of a TPMS is avoiding traffic accidents, poor fuel economy, and increased tire wear due to under-inflated tires through early recognition of a hazardous state of the tires. The OEM system falls flat on its face when it comes to meeting the target.

I have an OEM TPMS system on my new 2017 GL1800. It doesn't give any information about the tires until they are below some predetermined pressure or flat. That is when you see the dreaded TPMS idiot light.

On my GL1500 I used the Tire Gard and on my 2003 GL1800 I used the TireSafeGard. In August of 2016, I swapped the Tire Gard on the GL1500 to an FOBO Bike blue-tooth TPMS system. I like it so much that I am now using an identical system on my new 2017 GL1800.

The OEM TPMS system is okay I guess but with the aftermarket TPMS systems, there is so much more information available. The OEM system has an idiot light that says there may be a problem. The aftermarket systems tell you tire pressure, temperature in real time and in some cases the battery condition of the sensors.

I have the TireSafeGard TPMS on my 2003 GL1800 and it works well, except the display is not waterproof and needs to be stowed away when in a rain storm. The TireSafeGard sells for \$169 on Amazon.







# **Tire Gard**

I had been using the Tire Gard from Show Chrome on the GL1500. The Tire Gard now sells for \$87.99 on Amazon. Quite a price reduction from \$149 when I first bought one. This display too is not waterproof and needs to be stowed away when in a rain storm.

For \$99 or less, a FOBO Bike Blue Tooth TPMS system using a Smart Phone Application (App) started to look promising to me. It has audible and visual alerts. I recently bought one from Honda Direct Line for \$67.



### **How Motorist Awareness Saves Lives**

Motorist awareness was something I wished to be involved in from the first time I heard about it in a GWRRA University Class room. From that day on I have made it a passion of mine, to the point of being a pest at times, but even then, I hope some of these points were finding a place in the receiver's mind. I just did not ever want to write about it because of an experience that I experienced! On our way to the Tri-Cities the other day, to visit the Chapter L in their meeting, to see old friends, and to discuss motor awareness, along with handing out Tri-Folds, and stickers, and for Kaye to perform her duties as the Assistant District Director, I had the experience that follows, and the results that both Kaye and I felt, and the relief we both have, because of the training we have acquired through GWRRA. Following a chip truck just north of Eltopia, I radioed Kaye and said I was going to pass it, and then proceeded around it, speeding up, and keeping out of the NO-ZONE, while keeping alert to things that may be changing in my line of sight. All of sudden I noticed that he was moving over toward me, so I slowed down as I was only about half way past him! He then really came over very fast, and I saw that I was about to be forced off the road completely. I really got on my brakes, and was able to allow him to get past me, while I was still on pavement on the shoulder of the road. While I was busy avoiding being either run over or forced into the ditch, I heard Kaye yell, I think it was over the CB, but I will not swear to that. When it was all over, and I settled down, I knew that if I had not been aware of my position and watching closely, the outcome would have been very

different! This trucker is someone who should not have been driving, as he did not use his signals, nor did he use his mirrors to see if it was clear to move over. When I did pass him, he would not even look at me at that point. I hope he understood the destress he caused though his actions, on the road. I did give a rundown of this incident to the Chapter L members, and they told me that this sort of thing is common during harvest season, so be on the look out while on the road. Not all drivers out there are trained to be safe, or follow the rules of the road.

Again, I thank my experiences with the Motor Awareness, and my training through other GWRRA classes, that allow me now to tell you about this situation, and hope it will help someone in the future.


