

The vast majority of vehicles on the road are not motorcycles. They're cars and vans and trucks. It's quite possible that as a driver you rarely think about motorcycles.

This is a problem.

"When motorcycles and other vehicles collide, it is usually the other driver who violates the motorcyclist's right of way", according to an issue statement from NHTSA. "There is a continuing need to help other motorists 'think' motorcycles and to educate motorcyclists to be aware of this problem."

Why do drivers often violate motorcyclists' right of way? Motorcycles are relatively small and drivers don't see them Drivers don't anticipate motorcycles' movements. The driver's view of the motorcyclist is obstructed, often by the vehicle's blind spots or other vehicles

How do we, as motorcyclist, help other drivers not violate our right of way? We wear bright jackets, and helmets, lights on our motorcycle, flags, and any other ways of being noticed. There are times when we need to swerve to avoid road hazards. It is also true that we need to ride responsibly! I have seen some motorcyclist who cut in and out of traffic, speed, and not use their signals, and in general are a hazard to everyone on the road. We always need to be aware of the NO-ZONE, and not ride in it. Remember the rule, if you cannot see the driver of the vehicle, in front of you, in their mirror. They cannot see you. We as motorcyclist need to make an effort to educate others that we are out there, and we want to be safe and share the road with them. We can do this by making ourselves more visible by wearing our colors, and being friendly, and handing out safety materials and talking to them.

Participation in public bike shows, is a great way to invite the general public to become a participant in our passion for the ride.

THE GWRRA RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM



Well, here we are a month after District Rally and enjoying the summer. Riding 2 UP on our bikes or in a car. Watching the scenery go buy. Enjoying the ride. And I didn't forget those who ride solo. We have a lot of responsibility riding with us either on the bike or around us. How many people do you ride for? All the cars around us, how about the rider with us! For the cars around us, do you try to predict what the drivers around you are going to do? Are you always looking for a WAY OUT? I have found out after driving a Big Truck for some 20 years that I can almost predict what a driver is going to do. Have you found this to be true when you are riding? It could save your life someday, so try to develop this 6th sense. What about the CO-Rider with you? What responsibility does she {or he} have? Have you, as the Master and Commander of your world {on the bike at least}, trained your Co rider? This month's Wing World has a great article about "Riding the Back Seat LIKE A PRO" by Steve Lake on page 36. You would think by the Headline that the article is for the passenger. Read the story and you will quickly see it is an instruction lesson for you the RIDER. Yes, there are items in the story directly related to the co-rider but most is for You, the rider.

Have you ever explained how to mount and dismount the bike safely to your co-rider's ability? There are 12 first ride details a rider should do listed in the article. Ranging from what to do when cornering, proper and safe riding gear, and hand signals. Does the co-rider know that their EYES are part of the safety of the ride? 4 eyes are better than 2 when watching for hazards. The article has really helped me in instructing Helen {My Co Rider} on her ability to have a safe and fun ride when we are together. The whole idea of having the Big Machines is to ride in the most beautiful area, fresh air, wind in your face, leaning in those corners (you can still lean on 3 wheels), enjoying the company of fellow riders or on your own. And come back home in one piece to do it again. Remember the 4 items GWRRA stands for, Friends, Fun, Safety, and Knowledge.
