From the treasurer

How'd I get here? (on a GL1800 in the GWRRA) - Part 2

I left off last month with the discovery that a Yamaha Maxim 650 was not a comfortable ride for 2 people for more than a couple hours so I had found a 1987 GL1200 on Craigslist and setup a time to go see it. Knowing it was quite a bit bigger than my current ride, I was a little concerned about taking a test ride, but the seller didn't make a fuss about it. He handed me the keys and I took off. It was easier to ride than I had anticipated. I rode around for a bit, mostly on the highway, and it ran very well. It was the Interstate model and he was asking \$3200 for it. This was back in 2007. I don't remember the miles and I'm not at all good at price negotiation, but based on other GL1200's for sale, it seemed fair. I brought Ann along with me the next day. She got him to take \$3000 and I became a Gold Wing owner. Everything seemed fine on the bike. Nothing to repair that I recall. I took some local rides and rode it to work, but at that time, work was just 4 miles away. I found the gl1200goldwings.com website (which is still around today). I saw references on there to the infamous stator problems and also the stator plug that had a tendency to melt, but I don't recall that I did much to the bike for the first few years except brake pads. At some point I also walked up to a GWRRA table at the Honda dealership and joined up, not really having any idea what they did other than go on rides for ice cream!

I took 3 long rides on that GL1200. We were still living in DePere, Wisconsin near Green Bay. From there I made a trip to Lakeland Florida to my mom's house, about 1400 miles one way. I made the trip in October and figured I could ride 500 miles a day. I did make it, but ended up riding into the night a couple times, as the days were a bit short and I was averaging just 50 miles an hour with stops. The stops were more frequent than I had wanted because I learned that my G1200 seat was not at all comfortable, or perhaps my derriere was not conditioned for such abuse. I did have an AirHawk seat pad along with me, but it didn't seem to help much at all. I was mighty glad when I finally made it to Lakeland. I decided that on the way back, I would make a trip to the Tail of the Dragon on the way back which would take me out of my way, add an extra day and hopefully reduce the discomfort. I was probably not the right skill level for the Dragon, but I took it easy and made it through. The photo is from that ride.

I also made a trip to the Sturgis rally with a couple friends from work — Harley riders of course. There's quite a few of those in Wisconsin as you can imagine. To make it sound like I belonged, I recorded a tape of a Harley engine and played it over the speakers every once in a while.

The 3rd trip was with Ann from Green Bay to Niagara Falls for our anniversary. We rode up through the UP over the Mackinac Bridge, over the locks at Sioux Ste. Marie, then down through Canada, taking a ferry at one point before making it over to Niagara Falls. It was a 3 day trip to get there and things went well on the way there. But once we got there, the first problem with my bike cropped up and that's when I learned the value of being in GWRRA.

We were driving in the city and stopped at a stoplight when suddenly the bike just shut off. I was able to start it back up and drive down the road again, but at another stop it shut off again. Not good. I initially contacted a small local repair shop that agreed to look at it. I was able to ride there and he tried to track down the problem but he was not familiar with Gold Wings at all. He thought that it sounded like an ignition problem, so he started taking the ignition apart but after a couple hours, he had not found anything helpful and he had to close up shop. I decided then to go the Gold Book. I parked the bike outside his shop and started calling Niagara Falls wingers in the book. I eventually got hold of someone who said they thought they could find someone to help me. About an hour later, there were 5 or 6 guys standing around my bike! One of them was pretty sure of the issue and it was not the ignition. He tracked it down to a bad connection at the dog bone fuse. He fixed that up and got us on our way. Of course, they would only take a thank you for their time!

Then on the way home from Niagara, when I went out to start the bike up one morning, it would not start. It seemed to be the battery, but why did it go dead? Again I got hold of someone in the Gold Book and there were 2 guys there in no time helping me with the problem. They thought that I might have a bad regulator, but at that point, we just replaced the battery and got on our way. We made it home, taking a ferry across Lake Michigan on the way back.

The next big change came in 2010, when on May 4th, I and about 99 others were called into a meeting at my job and we were informed that we were all being outsourced. Our last day would be September 4th.

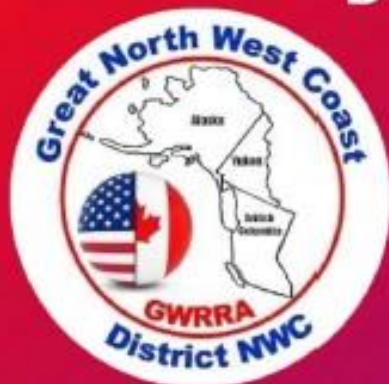

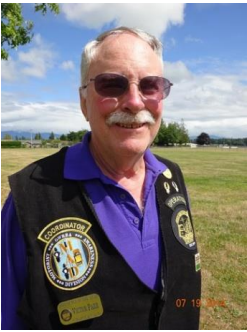

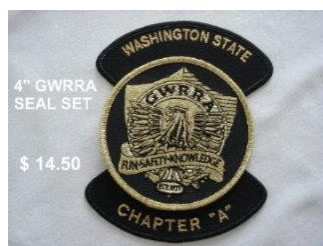
