How'd I get here? (on a GL1800 in the GWRRA) - Part 3

Last month left off with me getting outsourced from my job in Green Bay. It was sad news to be leaving folks we'd known and worked with for 17 years, but since our youngest daughter was just about to finish high school, it was good timing for such an event. I started applying for jobs. I had an interview with none other than Harley-Davidson, but that didn't work out (the employee discount would probably have impacted my motorcycle future). My manager at my Green Bay job then got contacted by a friend that was working for Costco's home office. Long story short, he took a position as a manager and then hired me. After living our entire lives in the midwest, Ann and I and our daughter moved out to the PNW in the fall of 2010.

At some point in 2011, Ann and I made a visit to the Chapter A meeting at the Triple X in Issaquah. I don't recall how I found out about it. I had attended a GWRRA chapter meeting in Green Bay and had joined GWRRA, so I think I just did a search for local chapters and found the GWRRA Chapter A website. It was probably in June, because the first email I have related to Chapter A is from Mike Briese on June 15th, 2011 (apparently I don't clean up my "sent" emails very often). I remember that Sam Grubbs sat and talked to us quite a while on that visit. I'm pretty sure Bill Holt, Mike, Don and Todd were there along with some others. We probably lost some money in a 50-50 that day, but we came back and have been with the chapter ever since.

I'll be honest. The first couple years of riding with the club were not always fun for me. Everyone was very friendly and welcoming, but I was constantly nervous on the rides. Everyone says to ride your own ride, but I still knew in the back of my mind that everyone I was riding with had many more years of riding experience than I did. I had only been riding for a few years while some of these folks would tell stories about riding before they had a license to drive, or going 120 MPH on a race track, or of the many rides and trips they'd taken together

over the years. I actually almost stopped going on rides, but eventually I was able to settle down, loosen up the gorilla grip and enjoy it.

We joined the group for a few rides that year and the next. Then one day in July 2012, Bill and Terri asked us to meet them on a ride out to Issaquah. We met them in a park and when we got there, Bill had this gorgeous black 1987 Gold Wing Aspencade. I think Terri called in Black Beauty and the photo shows that the name was well deserved. He invited us to take a ride on it. We told them we didn't have the money for a new bike, but they were pretty insistent. We took a ride and of course it was a definite step up in every way. Ended up that they made us a deal we couldn't refuse and we had a new ride, along with several boxes of parts from another GL1200 that Bill had stumbled on after the owner had disassembled it. I sold my old GL1200 to a fellow from Everett who had never ridden a wing before. I sold many of the parts on eBay. I also even put the Poor Boy alternator modification on the Aspencade. That is still the prettiest Gold Wing I've owned, but I didn't own it for very long.





Cost: 1 RV (cost depends on size of RV)

1 tent is \$49 + Tax (minus your Good Sam, AARP, etc. discount if applicable).

Add a Tent Trailer for \$15. Should be able to get 3 Tent Trailers to a spot. Some have electricity and some without. Some spots may hold 4 tent trailers.

Note: Be sure to use your discounts (Good Sam, AAA, AARP, etc.)

Register as a group or individually. If you register as a group, it is easier for them to have one person make the reservation for the entire group. Pay for the first night to hold each spot. You can settle up with your group at the end of the weekend. We currently have 15 spots reserved and are working on getting that raised to 20. We must reserve as many spots as we can before January since the park is filling up already and we don't want to be spread out here and there.

Minerva at the resort knows the spaces she saved for us...We may need more so we need to get what she has now, or they could be rented to outsiders... You can go look at the map on the web. You don't get what you want but she will group chapters together as best she can.

Some foods are provided, most are on your own. We do have a Grannies over by Columbia Center Mall, McDonald's and such up and down the CC Blvd. There are many other places around there also...just ask. Those suggested by the Park can be expensive. Famous Dave's has closed as has Old Country Buffett. Country Gentleman has good food also.

Everyone has to check into the Park at the office. You will be escorted to your lot...... I don't know yet if we will set up Spring Fling Registration near the Park Office or closer to our campsites.

What we really need to do is let the general public know. That is, we are just like them, just trying to enjoy this great place we call our world.


