Good afternoon everyone. As I sit here working on the April newsletter with the rain coming down outside, after a picture perfect riding day yesterday, I'm thinking there is a light at the end of the COVID-19 tunnel. I have been able to join in on two very nice rides in the month of March. Both rides were set up by Harry Rossignol our sister Chapter "V" ride coordinator. The first ride was on March 13th departing from the Denny's Restaurant in Auburn using secondary roads winding through Black Diamond, Hobart, Issaaquah, Snoqualmie valley, Duvall, Goldbar and on to our half way stop on US 2 at ZEKE'S road side restaurant for a delicious hamburger and fries.



After some good conversation at Zeke's, we started our second half of the ride back through Goldbar down through Duvall (Noting that the Pickle Time was open) past Snoqualmie falls, then onto SR18 then off to the Black Diamond/Issaquah road ultimately ending at the Maple Valley Dairy Queen at four 4 corners.



A fitting ending to a 175 mile ride (for me door to door) on what turned out to be a very nice riding day with Sun breaking out and 57 degree's. What more could we ask for in March!

Then on March 27th Harry setup another ride in an attempt to cross over Snoqualmie pass for a piece of pie at the Liberty Café on Blewett pass. (Our first ride over the pass for the year) Only to find out they are closed the month of March. So a change was made to Cle Elum. Keeping in mind the Weather forcast on the pass was Snow on Friday night and Snow 8" to 12" inches forcasted for Sunday, but Saturday was forcasted for a clear weather window? With pass temps between 37 to 44.

Those of us that took the chance for a good riding day (205 miles door to door for me) we were rewarded with a Picture Perfect day of riding in the Sun with temps up to 57 degrees on both sides of the cascades. From the treasurer

Not much riding going on mostly due to home projects, primarily having to get a side fence put up after the wind storm in January knocked it down. It was an old fence, but a contributing factor to weakening the fence was the fact that the neighbor's yard had "grown" higher since the fence was first built. By the time it blew down, the bottom of the fence on his side had anywhere from 6 inches to 2 feet of collected soil, leaves, pine needles, etc. I think that a previous owner had actually used one part of the fence as the side of a mulch pile. As a result, the fence had morphed into a fence / retaining wall over the years. A cedar fence is not a good retaining wall, so needless to say, over time that rotted out the bottom of many of the fence boards as well as the posts. The neighbor and I got quotes but we decided to just do it ourselves. He and a friend did the work on the fence and in the process moved it about a foot or so into his yard so that the fence posts would sit on top of the soil that had built up. That move then required me to build a retaining wall to keep that soil where it was and not just collapse into my yard. Where there once was just an old fence, there is now a new fence and a retaining wall that will hopefully hold up for a number of years.

Maybe next month there will be some riding to write about.





GWRRA Washington District 2021



Washington Counties Tour

In lieu of the 2021 Washington District Rally, the Washington District Team is offering you a chance to do what we all enjoy doing; riding throughout the State of Washington. This tour can be done on 2 wheels, 3 wheels, or 4 wheels (or horseback, if you want!!). You will be visiting a listed town (see page 2) in each of the 39 counties. Visit a business in each of the listed town and obtain a receipt. Submit the original receipts (1 per county/town) per person and a one-time \$10 registration fee per person to be eligible for cash prizes (and other prizes if we get great participation). We plan on using the cash we would normally give out at the rally for the Grand Prizes (\$750 this year). Therefore, we will have multiple cash prizes for the tour; \$300 for 1st place, \$200 for 2nd place, \$100 for 3rd place, \$50 for 4th, 5th, and 6th places. We will issue a ticket for each receipt submitted.

Chapter O also has an ongoing ride called the 5-Corner Ride (did you know there are 5 corners in Washington State!!). You can participate in that ride at the same time. See Chapter O's website for information.

You have the opportunity to earn extra tickets as well. For every 10 different counties/towns you submit a receipt for, you will earn an extra ticket. If you complete all 39 counties, you will earn two extra tickets. 10 different counties/towns = 11 tickets, 20 different counties/towns = 22 tickets, 30 different counties/towns = 33 tickets, all 39 different counties/towns = 44 tickets.

If you obtain receipts from the towns in the 5 corners of Washington (don't forget about Chapter O's 5-Corner Ride), you will earn an extra ticket.

We also have 9 bonus towns (that are not in Washington) in our neighboring States and Province (3 in Idaho, 3 in Oregon, and 3 in British Columbia). You can earn an extra ticket for each receipt from each of these towns.

If you complete the whole tour and the bonus towns, you can earn 54 tickets toward the prizes. If you finish the entire tour by August 1st, you can earn 6 extra tickets. Total of 60 tickets.

The Tour starts March 15th and ends September 30th. All receipts must be received by Mike White no later than 10 October. We will have the drawings sometime in October. If there is a workshop in October, will be drawn there. If not, will draw via Zoom Call. Need not be present to win.
