Helmet strap D-rings vs other options

I recently watched a video on the Youtube channel FortNine entitled "Why Motorcycle Helmets Use this Ancient Buckle." After I bought my first helmet about 15 years ago, I was standing at the checkout counter and saw a quick release snap adapter — the type that disconnects by squeezing the sides of the snap. It looked much easier and quicker to use than the D-ring that came with my helmet, so I picked one up and have used one ever since — until I watched this video. In the video, Ryan, the host of the channel and his sidekick put together a very simple device to test a few of the quick release connectors on the market along side the good old-fashioned D-ring connector. Since the straps on a helmet are designed to withstand 900 pounds of stress before snapping, a connector should not break until sometime after 900 pounds of stress — otherwise the strength of the connector has compromised the strength of the strap. If the connector breaks at 500 pounds, you will have lost nearly half of the protection provided by the strap. If the snap holds well enough that the strap breaks BEFORE the snap, then the snap has not compromised the strength of the strap.

If you watch the video, it is obviously not a highly scientific method of testing. The test device consists of a modified scissors jack and a torque wrench. But they are still able to get a pretty good estimate of the pounds of force that each snap (and the strap) can withstand. The ideal is that the strap breaks before the snap. But only the D-rings pass the test. All the snaps fail the test and break before the snap, some much earlier than others.

A side release buckle (like I had been using) snapped at 5.82 Nm / 329 pounds — so severely compromising the strength of the strap.

A micrometrical ratchet buckle snapped at 9.81 Nm / 555 pounds. Better, but still bad.

A Fidlock buckle snapped at 13.49 Nm / 763 pounds. Getting close, but still less than 900 pounds.

The D-ring did not fail — the strap broke at 15.91 Nm

So before my next ride, I removed my side release buckle and went back to the D-ring. Maybe I'm just easily persuaded, but their test convinced me that the D-ring connector sold with every helmet is really the best insurance for making sure your helmet stays on your head.

By the time you read this, we will have finished the Buzzard Butt Buster Ride and the WA-O Whale of a Picnic. It was the 35th year for the Buzzard Butt Buster and a 30th Birthday celebration for WA-O.

The Buzzard Butt Buster began in 1987 by Dick and JoAnn Buzzard. The Buzzard's Butt Buster is an annual motorcycle ride. The event is held each year around the middle of August with various destinations each year.

It is a charitable benefit for Pope's Kid's Place. Pope's Kid's Place exists to provide support for families with the challenges they face in caring for their medically complex child or young adult. The types of support they provide include respite care, long-term or transitional care, and residential care.

The ride format is very informal with riders riding in small groups or by themselves. This is a three/four day motel to motel event with sightseeing along the way. The event kicks off each year on Thursday evening with registration, check-in and an informal gathering. Day two is generally about a 300 mile ride to a known destination. There are no set routes, each rider or group of riders set up their own routes. A rider does not even need to ride a route. All one needs to do is be at the evening's motel for the evening to check in. After that, you are on your own.

Upon arrival participants are free to kick tires, jump in the pool or just enjoy the company of fellow riders. Day three is much like day two heading to a different destination, however the evening of day three we hold a banquet and celebration of the year's ride.

Day four is your safe return home. The event is put together by a group of volunteers and as such has no responsibility for the participants in the event. It is a wonderful way to ride, unwind and enjoy a few days of camaraderie and help a worthy cause.

I need to thank Mindy G. of WA-Z. She has known Dr. Pope and the ride organizers since she was very young and she is the reason some of us have the pleasure of riding in this event. Mindy did something special this year. She rides a 2006 GL1800 and has a 1995 GL1500. The GL1500 is for sale on consignment at a local motorcycle dealer. She has donated the proceeds from the sale of her GL1500 to Pope's Kids' Place. Kudos Mindy.

The WA-O Whale of a Picnic was on the 21st and it supported the local Food Bank. Ken Smith and the guys did a great job and went out of their way to get this thing set up and running. They provided an EXCELLENT lunch with all the trimmings. This year they did things a little differently. In years past, pre-registration was required to participate and have lunch. This year, on-site registration was instituted. That made it handy for the procrastinators and anyone that didn't know the ride was even happening until just before the event.

As it turned out, eight motorcycles with ten riders from WA-A, WA-I, WA-Q and WA-V rode up to Gorst from Tacoma to participate. Joe L., Mike B. and Kevin A. of WA-A; Kenny U., Ron and Dianna H. and Richard of WA-I; Chuck and Nancy C. of WA-Q; and Harry R. of WA-V were there.

A total of eleven motorcycles were at the event, and eight of them were ours. Joe won a set of tires. Kevin won the 50/50. Mike won the Outdoor 2 Burner Propane Cook Table and a NAPA Bucket of car cleaning supplies. The ride was a little over 60 miles long and there were no U-Turns.



Washington Counties Tour

In lieu of the 2021 Washington District Rally, the Washington District Team is offering you a chance to do what we all enjoy doing; riding throughout the State of Washington. This tour can be done on 2 wheels, 3 wheels, or 4 wheels (or horseback, if you want!!). You will be visiting a listed town (see page 2) in each of the 39 counties. Visit a business in each of the listed town and obtain a receipt. Submit the original receipts (1 per county/town) per person and a one-time \$10 registration fee per person to be eligible for cash prizes (and other prizes if we get great participation). We plan on using the cash we would normally give out at the rally for the Grand Prizes (\$750 this year). Therefore, we will have multiple cash prizes for the tour; \$300 for 1st place, \$200 for 2nd place, \$100 for 3rd place, \$50 for 4th, 5th, and 6th places. We will issue a ticket for each receipt submitted.

Chapter O also has an ongoing ride called the 5-Corner Ride (did you know there are 5 corners in Washington State!!). You can participate in that ride at the same time. See Chapter O's website for information.

You have the opportunity to earn extra tickets as well. For every 10 different counties/towns you submit a receipt for, you will earn an extra ticket. If you complete all 39 counties, you will earn two extra tickets. 10 different counties/towns = 11 tickets, 20 different counties/towns = 22 tickets, 30 different counties/towns = 33 tickets, all 39 different counties/towns = 44 tickets.

If you obtain receipts from the towns in the 5 corners of Washington (don't forget about Chapter O's 5-Corner Ride), you will earn an extra ticket.

We also have 9 bonus towns (that are not in Washington) in our neighboring States and Province (3 in Idaho, 3 in Oregon, and 3 in British Columbia). You can earn an extra ticket for each receipt from each of these towns.

If you complete the whole tour and the bonus towns, you can earn 54 tickets toward the prizes. If you finish the entire tour by August 1st, you can earn 6 extra tickets. Total of 60 tickets.

The Tour starts March 15th and ends September 30th. All receipts must be received by Mike White no later than 10 October. We will have the drawings sometime in October. If there is a workshop in October, will be drawn there. If not, will draw via Zoom Call. Need not be present to win.
