My eyes have been wandering. I am being tempted by a younger, slimmer model. Maybe it's the pandemic. Too much time away from my current model. Pre-pandemic, we would 'get together' a few times a week, but that has faded and now I covet another. I didn't mean for it to happen, it just did (isn't that what they always say?). I can't even recall the first time I saw her. But now every chance I get, I look for more images online. Maybe it's because she's practically naked, or I should probably say a practially naked bike.

She is the exact opposite of what I have ridden for years. The Royal Enfield Int650. Yes, she has less power --- a LOT less. But I can see all the parts, and she weighs a LOT less. Just a parallet twin engine. Yes, made in India, but it and it's sister model the Continental GT were revamped in 2018 and have garnered very good reviews and reliability ratings. And you can buy 4 or 5 of these for the price of a new Gold Wing. Plus, there are many opportunities for customizing, and that customizing doesn't require you to first remove the fairing, the saddlebags, the fenders, the seat ... ok maybe the seat. But not much at all.

I did actually go to the dealer in downtown Seattle and sit on one. I think they had gotten a mix of 8 or 10 of the two models in just a few days before and just one of the Int650 version was still available, so they seem to be popular. I didn't get to ride one, but I did put it up on the center stand. Due to my years of conditioning with the Gold Wing, I almost launched it through the window.

The problem is I don't have room for 2 bikes, and despite the temptation, when I jump on my Gold Wing, I still love to ride it. But I sure am tempted to try something younger, slimmer, naked-er..





I was excited - We were ready for our first sit down meeting April 24th.

It was now time for us to start having gatherings again. We were actually going to have a group gathering, have a meal and then discuss GWRRA events, both past, present and vet to happen and then go for a ride.

I had been out to the Golden Steer several times in the weeks leading up to the day of our first gathering of 2021. I had breakfast at the Golden Steer in March and talked with one of our waitresses to let her know that we were waiting for things to open back up so we could come back and patronize them. She was anticipating getting her first Covid shot sometime in late March.

Then they scared us. The Golden Steer closed for remodeling. Arrgghh! It looked like our first meeting of 2021 was not going to happen. It looked bleak. Todd and I tried calling, visiting and checking online but could not find anything that would give us a clue as to when they would re-open.

Finally at the end of the second week in April, I called and got an answer. Yes, they were planning a Grand Re-Opening the third weekend of April. Just seven days before our gathering. What a relief. The gathering went off without a hitch and we had twelve GWRRA members in attendance. Looks like we were off to a good start for 2021.

So, May rolls around and on Tuesday the 18th I get a text that Don has encountered a speed bump on his highway of life and will not be able to publish a newsletter and oh, by the way, he is not going to make it to the meeting this coming Saturday either. Darn. As I was thinking how it just would not be a Chapter WA-A gathering without Don, I get a text from Todd. He says he has to be out of town on Saturday and won't be able to come to the meeting either.

Now what. No Chapter director and no Assistant Chapter Director. Should we cancel yet another gathering? We have worked so hard to get things rolling again? Nope, let's just keep on keeping on. I can pick up some 50/50 tickets and everyone can have breakfast and it will just all work out.

Saturday morning rolls around and we are ready to go. Pen is in the car with the engine idling. I check the tire pressure on the GL1800. Hmmm.. the FOBO is reporting that the rear tire is about three PSI low. No problem. I grab the air hose and air chuck with the pressure gauge on it, get on the floor, roll the tire around for a visual check and... yup, you guessed it. Screw in the center of the tread.

Oh well, I happen to have a back up. The GL1500 is ready to go. Tire pressures are close enough according the FOBO. The front tire could use a PSI or two but it should be fine. One thing though, the routes I have planned for the after meeting ride are on the GPS on the GL1800. Luckily the GPS instruments are the same and will mount and fit on either bike. Problem solved (I think). I didn't realize until later that the audio connector for the GL1800 is different than the audio connector for the GL1500. It has a pretty good speaker though and I could still hear the turn by turn directions while riding.

We make it to Kent. I stop at the gas station to fill up the tank and then head to the Golden Steer. We have ten folks for breakfast. Breakfast was good.

At the end of the gathering my phone is sounding an alarm. At first I did not know what it meant but it turned out that I had low pressure on my front tire of the GL1500. It was at 36 psi and 39 psi is the set point. I should have looked closer at the pressures before I left home. No worries, I carry a small pump with me in the saddlebag. I aired up the tire before we left the parking lot. I was in a hurry and didn't check the pressure. I put in too much. A couple of miles down the road my phone was alarming again because the pressure was now over 45 psi. A quick stop and a little PPFFTTT... and a pressure check and it was all good. We had a nice little 100 mile ride

That afternoon at home, I initially pulled the screw out of the GL1800 tire and plugged it. But, I had second thoughts. I was scheduled to ride to Tri Cities pulling a camping trailer the next weekend. I decided to pull the wheel, remove the tire and patch it properly. That only took about an hour and a half or so.

Moral of the story, "The best laid schemes o' mice an' men. Gang aft a-gley". Or to translate, the best laid plans of mice and men can still go wrong. No matter how well you plan, there is no guarantee of success.





GWRRA Washington District 2021



Washington Counties Tour

In lieu of the 2021 Washington District Rally, the Washington District Team is offering you a chance to do what we all enjoy doing; riding throughout the State of Washington. This tour can be done on 2 wheels, 3 wheels, or 4 wheels (or horseback, if you want!!). You will be visiting a listed town (see page 2) in each of the 39 counties. Visit a business in each of the listed town and obtain a receipt. Submit the original receipts (1 per county/town) per person and a one-time \$10 registration fee per person to be eligible for cash prizes (and other prizes if we get great participation). We plan on using the cash we would normally give out at the rally for the Grand Prizes (\$750 this year). Therefore, we will have multiple cash prizes for the tour; \$300 for 1st place, \$200 for 2nd place, \$100 for 3rd place, \$50 for 4th, 5th, and 6th places. We will issue a ticket for each receipt submitted.

Chapter O also has an ongoing ride called the 5-Corner Ride (did you know there are 5 corners in Washington State!!). You can participate in that ride at the same time. See Chapter O's website for information.

You have the opportunity to earn extra tickets as well. For every 10 different counties/towns you submit a receipt for, you will earn an extra ticket. If you complete all 39 counties, you will earn two extra tickets. 10 different counties/towns = 11 tickets, 20 different counties/towns = 22 tickets, 30 different counties/towns = 33 tickets, all 39 different counties/towns = 44 tickets.

If you obtain receipts from the towns in the 5 corners of Washington (don't forget about Chapter O's 5-Corner Ride), you will earn an extra ticket.

We also have 9 bonus towns (that are not in Washington) in our neighboring States and Province (3 in Idaho, 3 in Oregon, and 3 in British Columbia). You can earn an extra ticket for each receipt from each of these towns.

If you complete the whole tour and the bonus towns, you can earn 54 tickets toward the prizes. If you finish the entire tour by August 1st, you can earn 6 extra tickets. Total of 60 tickets.

The Tour starts March 15th and ends September 30th. All receipts must be received by Mike White no later than 10 October. We will have the drawings sometime in October. If there is a workshop in October, will be drawn there. If not, will draw via Zoom Call. Need not be present to win.
