### March 2022

Hi guys. In the middle of February Harry and I were at a chapter gathering and a few folks were curious about a certain subject. So curious that they asked the Chapter Director to crack open the magazine and canvass the gathering. Apparently there was a short blurb in the February Wing World magazine in the TECH section.

Here is what it said: "BRAKES • Brake fluid: Replace every 2 years regardless of mileage. Replace every year if you have ABS (factory recommendations) Tip: Replace brake bleeders with speed bleeders and brake bleeding will be a 10-minute easy job. Clutch fluid (brake fluid is used here): Replace every 2 years, regardless of mileage. (Tip: Speed bleeder makes this a 5-minute easy job.)"

The specific questions were; "Do they work?" "How do they work?" "How much do they cost?" Of course I opened my big mouth and then someone asked if I recommended them. Also, do they work in four wheeled vehicles.

I'm here to tell you that they do work. They are about \$7.00 to \$10.00 each. You can buy them online at Auto Zone or NAPA. And they do work in four wheelers. And yes, I do recommend them and I have installed them on six or seven motorcycles and a GMC pick-up truck. But, the Wing World article is a bit misleading. It will take you much longer than 5 minutes to bleed your brakes. Speed Bleeders are a definite labor saving device but they are not magic.



This is what a Sped Bleeder looks like externally and internally. Externally you can distinguish it as a Speed Bleeder by a brass insert at the nipple. Normal bleeders do not have the brass insert. That insert is what holds the spring and check ball in place.


Once a Speed Bleeder is installed, bleeding your brakes is a one person operation. To bleed, loosen the bleeder 1/4 turn. Fluid will not leak from the bleeder because of the spring loaded check ball keeping the port closed. Pressure applied by the master cylinder will off-seat the ball and allow air and fluid to pass. Put a hose on the bleeder (preferably a clear hose) that will extend into a catch receptacle.

Squeeze the brake handle or depress the brake pedal. It generally takes about 5 pumps to purge each caliper or wheel cylinder. When bubble free fluid is evident you close the Speed Bleeder screw. In the closed position it works just like your stock bleeder screw and prevents any brake fluid from leaking out.

You will find that speed bleeders come in many different diameters, thread pitches lengths. It is up to the installer to know what bleeder to buy and use.

All the bleeders that I have replaced were all 8 x 1.25 mm in size. The calipers and clutch cylinder have all been the medium length bleeders except for the GL1500. You need a long bleeder for the clutch.

When it comes to motorcycles that have been triked, you will have to remove a bleeder screw and check it's physical size.


