# **Chapter Treasurer – November 2022**



#### From the treasurer

#### Tesla + darkness + motorcycles = bad news

Since I began riding, I have had a personal rule to never ride at night in the rain. I will ride at night if the roads are dry. I will ride in the rain during the day, but I don't mix the two. I have had to do it occasionally but I try to avoid it. Based on some recent articles I have read, I'm going to have to revise my rule to not ride at night when it's raining or when there are Teslas on the road. That second one is obviously going to be tough to avoid without just avoiding night riding altogether, especially now that there are quite a few Teslas on the road. Here's why...

I have now read of 5 accidents involving Teslas rear ending motorcycles while the car was in autonomous or "auto-pilot" mode. All five of these occurred at night. Apparently the cameras on the Tesla seem to think that the rear lights on a motorcycle are the lights of something further in the distance, probably because they are so close together, or because there is just one light. So the car just keeps driving down the road at the same speed until it suddenly hits the motorcycle. Most if not all of these accidents have resulted in the biker being killed. I didn't hear about this happening until the last year and there seems to be a reason for that.

Apparently Tesla originally used radar on their vehicles in combination with cameras to determine what was up ahead. The problem was that occasionally the radar and the cameras would disagree. In that situation, the car would respond based on which input detected the most danger. But occasionally that would result in the car braking to avoid something that wasn't actually there. To solve this problem, the Tesla engineers recently (April 27 2021)

decided to just stop putting radar on the Tesla Model 3 and Model Y, and according to a friend that owns a Tesla, they disabled the radar on the models built prior to that date. Without the radar, they now have just the one input from the cameras, therefore no problem with a disagreement between the cameras and the radar. Easy fix, eh? Sort of like when you disagree with your neighbor about the location of a new fence between your yards. If the neighbor disagrees, just get rid of the neighbor and voila, no disagreement!

Unfortunately the cameras on the car may not be so good at determining that when they "see" the rear light(s) on a motorcycle, they aren't the lights of a car or truck that is far away but they are a motorcycle that's smack dab in front of the car!

Now of course, drivers are not supposed to just put the car in auto-pilot mode and then read a book / put on makeup / check their email / catch a nap, etc. The driver is supposed to continue to pay attention so that they can respond when they detect a situation that the car seems to be missing. Tesla even says this and so they also say they are not at fault when the car fails to correctly interpret what it "sees" — the driver is at fault. But then Tesla still uses the term "auto-pilot" to describe the autonomous driving mode. So unless the driver understands that it's not really an auto-pilot system and they still need to be responsible and alert while the car is in auto-pilot mode, they won't be paying attention to watch for dangerous situations, like when the car does not realize it is about to rear-end a motorcycle. Germany has actually banned the term "auto-pilot" as false advertising and it is clearly very misleading. Even if Tesla calls it something else, we know that drivers will still use the assisted driving mode as though it doesn't require human input and they won't pay attention in the way that they should.

How can you avoid this problem? There is no way that I know of to avoid it right now outside of not riding at night at all. So if you do ride at night, be alert for a fast approaching Tesla in your rear view mirror! They're easy to spot — they're the cars that don't make any noise aside from the tires on the highway.  $\colon (\colon )\colon (\colo$

Unfortunately, no one really knew that the site were down or what had happened to them. There was a bit of a delay between the time I started to make contact and I got the first reply. No one I had contacted even knew that there was a problem until I brought up the subject. It took about five days before everyone had weighed in.

I've had the job of maintaining the Chapter WA-A site for a little over a decade. Keeping the site up to date and correct has been interesting and a bit tedious at the times. I fail a lot but it is usually because I do not properly proof read the pages or I just plain forget to go back and check the page after it has been posted on the web. Checking your work is always a good way to make sure you prevent embarrassment.


