A ride I hope to take someday

Walking the dog 2 to 4 times a day allows a lot of time for listening to Youtube videos. Although I don't seem to get enough time to take the long trips I would like to take, I still listen to videos about motorcyle trips, packing, places to go and motorcycle camping. As a result, Youtube would drop videos on those subjects into my feed and at some point, one of the videos was about riding the Dalton Highway to Prudhoe Bay. The road was built in 1974 to facilitate the building of the Alaskan Pipeline, so it's primary purpose is for trucks and due to the neverending permafrost north of Fairbanks, the road almost entirely unpaved. So it's not a road for a Gold Wing. Lighter dual purpose bikes like the V-Strom 650, Versys 650, KLR 650 and other off-road capable bikes are usually used. Enough power to carry the necessary gear, but not too heavy to pick up when necessary. And also something reasonbly comfortable for the ride on the way to the Dalton. (I did see a video about a couple guys making the trip on Honda Cub 125s --- I would want a little more horsepower than that.)

After watching several videos about it, it's become a trip that I hope to take someday, but it will probably have to wait for retirement in a couple years. Just getting from Seattle to Fairbanks where the highway starts would take a week or more. It's then 250 miles to Coldfoot, where there is a campground. Since the trip would be in July, it should be warm and daylight all day, so camping is not bad for a night. However that is the last stop for gas, so you need enough gas either in your tank or that plus another gallon or two carried along to make it the rest of way. The last 250 miles is also where the weather can be very unpredictable as you go over Atigun Pass and the Contintental Divide. Once you make it to Prudhoe Bay, there are a couple motels, which is good because there are polar bears around so camping is not really an option.

You can't ride all the way to the Beaufort Sea because that area is restricted. However you can pay for a bus ride through the restricted area to spend a few minutes on the "beach." The challenge of getting there and getting to see places along the way that most people (even most world travelers) don't get to see is the draw for me. I do have a friend that has said he would also like to make the trip, but it will be at least 2 years and retirement before I can attempt it. Maybe it will happen, maybe it won't. Maybe I'll buy a V-Strom 650 and find that I have been too spoiled by the Gold Wing to make such a long trip on a bike 1/3 the size. Time will tell.


