I'm writing this on May 13, two days before DJ (new) and I will travel to Europe for our fifth Edelweiss motorcycle tour in four years. By the time you see this, we will already be on our way from Athens Greece toward Dubrovnik Croatia. The tour will also travel through Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Montenegro, and North Macedonia. I didn't want to write something for the newsletter while out on the road, so I'm writing it prior to the trip.

Shortly after we get back, June 5-7, Walt and DJ (original) will be leading us on a three-day trip along the Oregon coast. The plan is to take the highway from Seattle on Friday June 5 all the way (over 400 miles) to Grants Pass in southern Oregon. And it won't work with aftermarket seats, just stock Honda ones. It is a plug that goes in-line with the seat heater plug and makes the seat hotter. It works very well. I never have to turn mine hotter than 2. Check them out. They are so worth it.**





# Will there be an after-meeting ride this month? We have five Saturdays this month, will there be a Five Aces Ride?

Surprisingly, I have the answer to both questions. Let's talk about the second question first.

You probably didn't know but this month's Five Aces Ride is more than an ice cream ride. It is a tribute to Don Hatley in a way that he certainly would have loved. A leisure ride to his old stomping grounds following secondary roads culminating with a frozen dessert.

The route starts at the Kent McDonald's restaurant parking lot, 8320 S 212th St, Kent, WA 98032 and going to points north. Kick stands up at 9:00 am, May 30th. 95% of the route takes us over secondary roads. It is a 130-mile route north followed by a 95-mile route south to the Maple Valley Dairy Queen, 23924 SE Kent-Kangley Rd, Maple Valley.

The route north will take about 3 hours and 30 minutes. At approximately 10:20 am there is an intermediate stop at the Snohomish Park and Ride, 1700 Avenue D (east of Hwy 9) in Snohomish, WA 98290. This stop will be a rally point for any Chapter C members that would like to join us for ice cream at the Snow Goose Produce. The Park and Ride is about 10 minutes east of Patty's Egg Nest where Chapter C meets for their meetings. It is just southeast of a Hwy 9 traffic circle at Bickford Ave and 1.5 miles south of Hwy 2.

Leaving there will take us north to Burlington where we will make a brief excursion to say hello to Don at his final resting place and then on to the Snow Goose Produce for ice cream. At approximately noon, we will be at Snow Goose Produce.

After ice cream, we head south on secondary roads once again. The time to Maple Valley will be about 2 hours and 45 minutes. It will be a double ice cream day.

The after meeting ride this month is to the Dairy Queen in Yelm, 1202 Yelm Ave, Yelm, WA. Similar to the Five Aces Ride, I intend to stay away from major highways in an attempt to only use secondary roads.

We will leave the Rainbow Café after the meeting, probably around 11:00 am. We will head west to W.Valley Highway and head south through Sumner, Puyallup, Graham, Eatonville to Hwy 7 and then north on Hwy 7 back towards Tacoma and then west to Yelm for ice cream at Dairy Queen. The ride to Yelm is about 80 miles and will take about 2 hours.

# Overnight Parking Side-stand or center-stand? Cover it or not?

You are out on an overnighter and are parking the bike for the evening. The winds are up. Do you use a cover or not? Put it up on the center stand or leave it on the side stand?

Let me deal with the second question first - it is the easiest. Rule-of-thumb: Unless you are parked inside a garage on concrete, use your side stand! Your side stand provides a WIDE tripod as compared to your center stand. As such, it provides far more stable parking for your motorcycle. The sole exception to this is if you are unable to park such that the bike leans firmly on the side stand. For example, if your shocks or tire pressure are low, your luggage weight is high, or the ground slopes to the right. If the bike is not leaning firmly on your side stand it can rather easily be pushed over to the right side.

Though high winds and bike covers do not go well together, I always use mine when I'm out on an overnighter. This, to tend to minimize the risks of theft and curiosity seekers taking liberties (even good-natured parents have taken the liberty of placing one of their children in a bike's saddle they were walking by without getting the bike owner's permission.) Further, I'd rather the cover get damaged from windblown sand and other debris than the finish on my bike. Remember to use some form of fastener to cinch together the bottom edges of your cover under the bike to keep it from flying off (and to further deter someone who might even think about stealing the bike.)

## A hidden connection point

I've been searching for a way to connect Garmin GPS to my 2022 GL1800. I have Car Play, IF I have cell coverage, but there are many times I don't have that when on a trip. Country places away from cities are my fav. Recently I was looking at electricalconnection.com and found "Fairing Power Splitter & Tap" for Goldwings 18+ which is their SKU 02214. This connector will plug into a OEM point provided from the factory with a dummy plug found behind the L side Tupperware above the cooling system fan. [Does not require removal of top shelter.] On accessory setting I tested output from it at just a bit over 12 volts. Unfortunately, my Garmin Drive 50 will not give full brightness connected to a USB so I need the 12v automotive 'fob' type converter outputting 5v which Garmin provides for car usage. Maybe this will be of interest to others. Now I will try to install a cigarette style outlet like what is standard on new Wings using this new tap. Questions or suggestions? You're welcome to contact me.

We have been given permission to use the triangle in Oregon again, so we won't be putting extra miles and gas usage on the bikes.

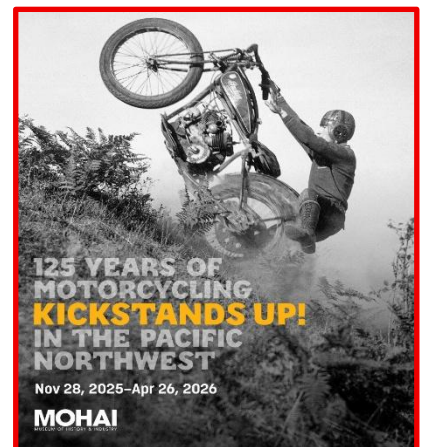

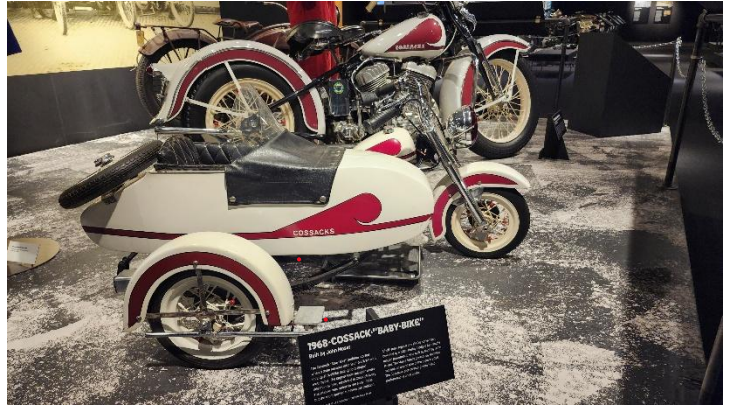
**Karen Thomson on her first BMW R65, 1980**

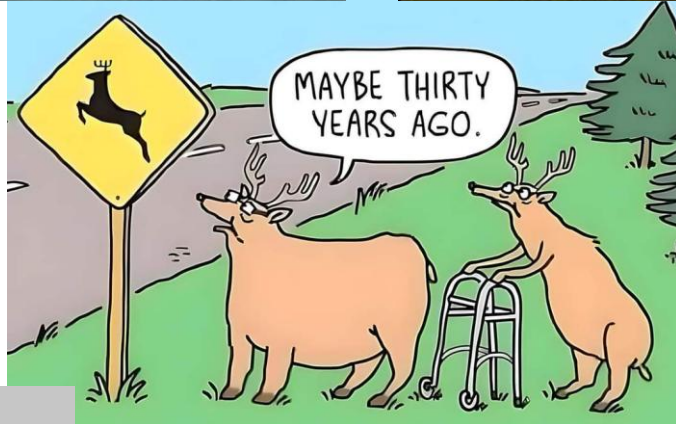

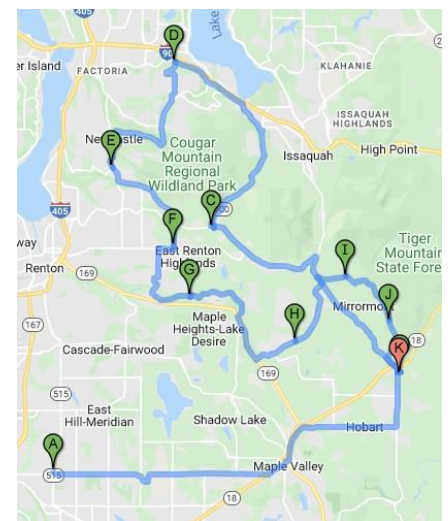
